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









Precipitation outlook



Wet day frequency shifts Forecast for: January to March 2017

JFM 2017 Frequency of wet days




USUALLY: Across the region during November-December-January, about 20 to 40 days out of a total of 90 days are wet days.

FORECAST: JFM rainfall is likely to be above- to normal in much of the region, By contrast, below- to normal is forecast for Bahamas, Belize and Cuba. We forecast little change from the usual amount of wet days (very low confidence).

IMPLICATION:

- Disruptions of outdoor activities by rainfall tend to be few as compared to other times of the year.
- Surface dryness will increase faster in the extreme north and west of the region than elsewhere.


Precipitation outlook

Wet spells frequency shifts Forecast for: January to March 2017




USUALLY: Up to 3 wet spells (ABC Islands and coastal Guianas: up to 4) occur from January to March, with up to 1 of them ending up very wet (ABC Islands: up to 2; coastal Guianas: up to 3).

FORECAST: JFM rainfall is likely to be above- to normal in much of the region, By contrast, below- to normal is forecast for Bahamas, Belize and Cuba. We forecast little change from the usual amount of wet days, wet spells or very wet spells (very low confidence).

IMPLICATION:

• Depletion of large reservoirs during dry season likely slower than in 2015.

Wet days outlook




Wet spells outlook

Extreme wet spells frequency shifts Forecast for: January to March 2017

JFM 2017 frequency of extreme (top 1%) **3-day wet spells**



USUALLY: Virtually no extreme wet spells occur between January and March, except in coastal Guianas (up to 1) which are in their short wet season.

FORECAST: JFM rainfall is likely to be above- to normal in much of the region, By contrast, below- to normal is forecast for Bahamas, Belize and Cuba. We forecast little change from the usual amount of wet days, wet spells or very wet spells (very low confidence). Apart from the coastal Guianas, we forecast no extreme wet spells (high confid.).

IMPLICATION: Flash flood potential not a major concern until the end of March, with the possible exception of the Guianas.
