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













Wet day frequency shifts

Forecast for: November 2016 to January 2017

NDJ 2016-'17 frequency of wet days




USUALLY: Across the region during November-December-January, about 30 to 50 days are wet days.

FORECAST: NDJ rainfall is likely to be above- to normal in much of the region; however, with 10% to 20% less wet days (medium to high confid.) in Aruba, parts of Guyana and Trinidad & Tobago. By contrast, below- to normal is forecast for Bahamas, Barbados, Belize, Cuba, and Windwards.

IMPLICATION:


Regular disruptions of outdoor activities by rainfall; but fewer than usual in Aruba, Grenada, parts of Guyana and Trinidad & Tobago.




Wet spells frequency shifts

NDJ 2016-'17 frequency of 7-day very wet spells




USUALLY: Near the end of the wet season (Guianas: transition from dry to wet season; ABC Islands: wet season), roughly 2 to 5 wet spells (ABC Islands: 3 to 8) occur from November to January, of which 1 to 3 are very wet (ABC Islands: 1 to 6).


FORECAST: NDJ rainfall is likely to be above- to normal in much of the region; however, with 10% to 20% less wet days (medium to high confid.) in Aruba, parts of Guyana and Trinidad & Tobago. By contrast, below- to normal is forecast for Bahamas, Barbados, Belize, Cuba, and Windwards. At present, we do not forecast any significant shifts in wet spells (low confid.).

IMPLICATION:

Recharge of large water reservoirs by rainfall is expected in most places.








Extreme wet spells frequency shifts

Forecast for: November 2016 to January 2017

NDJ 2016-'17 frequency of extreme (top 1%) 3-day wet spells



USUALLY: Up to 1 or 2 extreme wet spells occur from October to December (ABC Islands: up to 3).

FORECAST: NDJ rainfall is likely to be above- to normal in much of the region; however, with 10% to 20% less wet days (medium to high confid.) in Aruba, parts of Guyana and Trinidad & Tobago. By contrast, below- to normal is forecast for Bahamas, Barbados, Belize, Cuba, and Windwards. At present we do not forecast any significant shifts in wet spells (low confid.) or extreme wet spells (medium to high confid.).

IMPLICATION: Some flash flood potential developing.
