


A % above-normal rainfall N % normal rainfall D % below-normal rainfal

AMJ 2016 Wet Days Frequency Shift




USUALLY: Number of wet days is low in April, and usually increases in May and June.

FORECAST: AMJ rainfall in the Caribbean is likely to be above- to normal across the Caribbean, with more wet days (medium confidence) in the Eastern Caribbean, especially in May and June.

IMPLICATION:


Decreasing surface dryness; increasing number of days with disrupted outdoor activities; limited to no recharge of water reservoirs until April.




Wet spells frequency shifts

AMJ 2015 frequency of 7-day very wet spells





USUALLY: Number of wet spells is very low in April in eastern Caribbean, and increases in most places in May and June.

FORECAST: AMJ rainfall in the Caribbean is likely to be above- to normal across the Caribbean, with more wet days (medium confidence), more wet & very wet **spells** (*medium* to high confidence) in the Eastern Caribbean, especially in May and June.

IMPLICATION:

Increasing surface and soil wetness; good recharge of water reservoirs from May to June.






MAM 2016 frequency of extreme (top 1%) 3-day wet spells










AMJ 2016 Wet Days Frequency Shift







USUALLY: Very few extreme wet spells occur in April, with a chance of generally up to 1-2 extreme wet spell in May & June.

FORECAST: AMJ rainfall in the Caribbean is likely to be above- to normal across the Caribbean, with more wet days (medium confidence), more wet & very wet spells (medium to high confidence), more extreme wet spells (medium confidence) in the Eastern Caribbean, especially in May and June.

IMPLICATION: Limited flash flood potential up until April, but a marked increase from May.
