Notable Observations


- The Caribbean remains hot, particularly the southern Caribbean where heat stress is predicted to persist through to December, presenting a worry for the health of coral reefs throughout the region.
- Bleaching alert level 1 stress level existing in SE Jamaica, SW Hispaniola, Leeward Is., and Windward Is. Alert level 2 conditions throughout the Leeward Antilles, Trinidad and Tobago, and Belize.

- ➤ Cape Verde Is., NW. Hawaiian Is., Guam, Palau, N. Philippines, and Eritrea under Alert Level 1. Yucatan Peninsula, N. Mariana Is., W. and E. FSM, China, Vietnam, Ogasawara Is., Sudan, Tabuk and Al Madinah and Makkah (Saudi Arabia), and Gulf of Suez under Alert Level 2.




CARIBBEAN CORAL REEF WATCH

Alert Level	Interpretation
No Stress	No Thermal Stress
Watch	Low-level thermal stress
Warning	Thermal stress is accumulating
Alert level 1	Bleaching expected
Alert level 2	Widespread bleaching and some mortality expected

Current Outlook (September-December 2020)


▶ 4-Month Outlook indicates that Coral Bleaching Heat Stress for much of the Caribbean will be at Alert Level 2 in October persisting through November.

Caribbean Satellite Bleaching Alert Area and Outlook 2020-09-30




Bleaching Outlook Weeks 17-20 (Feb)

Caribbean Bleaching Outlook

The bleaching outlook suggest most of the Southern and Eastern Caribbean will be under Alert Level 2 in 1-4 weeks, persisting through weeks 5-8. Heat stress expected to decrease in 9-12 weeks despite some areas of persisting high heat stress in S. Caribbean.
