





Wet day frequency shifts

Precipitation outlook




FMA 2022

USUALLY: Out of 90 days in Feb-Mar-Apr, there are about 15 to 30 wet days (ABC Islands: 5-15; coastal Guianas: 20-45).

FORECAST: FMA rainfall may be wetter than usual in the ABC Islands, the Guianas, and the Lesser Antilles, with an expected increase in wet days there as well (medium confid.), but usual rainfall or drier elsewhere.




IMPLICATIONS:

 Limited wildfire potential and local airborne dust towards April from Dominica southwards, but a possible increase from the Dom. Rep. westwards.

Wet spells frequency shifts



Precipitation outlook






FMA 2022 frequency of 7-day wet spells


USUALLY: Up to 3 wet spells (coastal Guianas: up to


IMPLICATIONS:

- **Increased flooding potential from Dominica southwards** in the islands starting April and in the coastal Guianas throughout the period.
- Possible decline of inflows in dams and reservoirs for the western Caribbean.
- Slower than usual depletion of water reservoirs for the core of the dry season from Dominica southwards.

Forecast for: February to April 2022





FMA 2022 frequency of extreme (top 1%) 3-day wet spells

USUALLY: Up to 1 extreme wet spell occurs from February to April in the coastal Guianas and in mountainous areas of other countries.

FORECAST: FMA rainfall may be wetter than usual in the ABC Islands, the Guianas, and the Lesser Antilles, with an expected increase in wet days there as well (medium confid.), but usual rainfall or drier elsewhere. An increase in wet and very wet spells may be expected across most of the region (low confid.).


Extreme wet spells are not on forecast across the region.











IMPLICATIONS:

 Marginal increase if any for flash flood, landslide/rockfall and soil erosion potential in Belize and the islands through March.
