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


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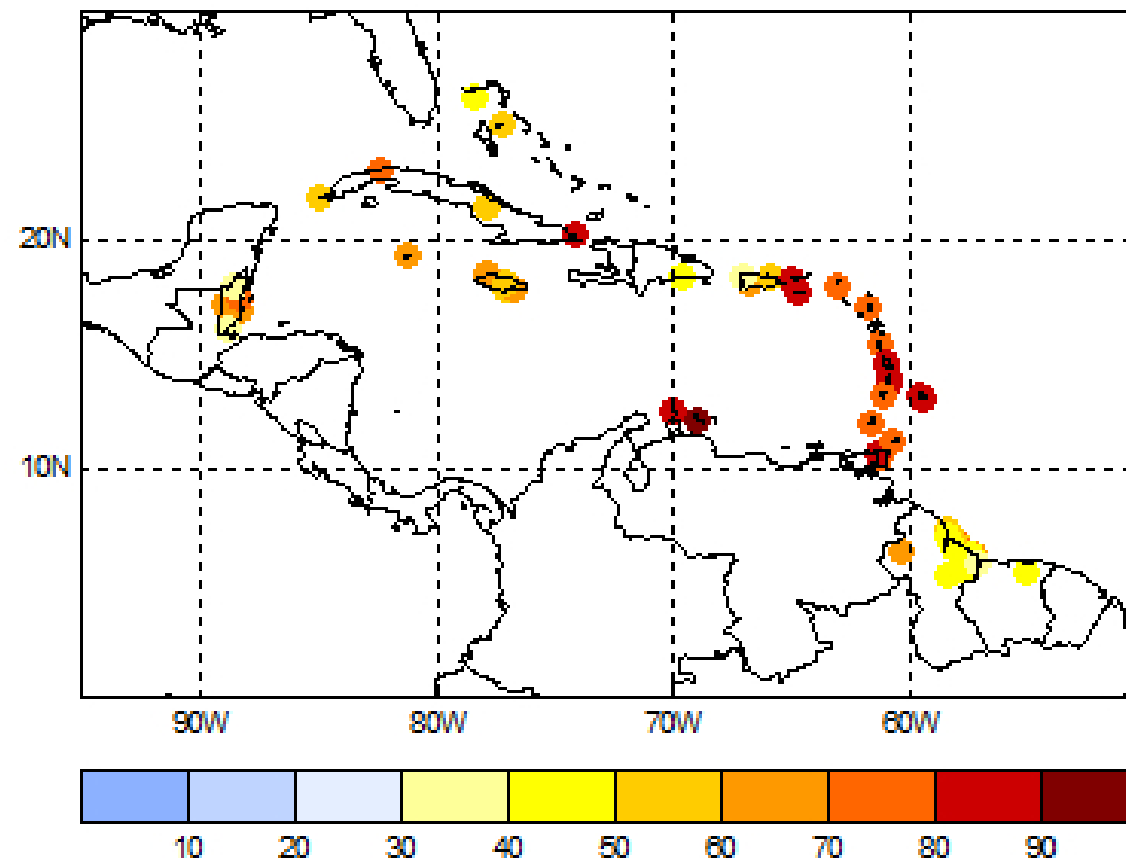
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# Flash flood potential associated with excessively wet days – in Oct.-Nov.-Dec. 2022

<b>SLIGHT</b>		10-20%
<b>MARGINAL</b>		0-10%






Flash flood potential in Oct-Nov-Dec 2022

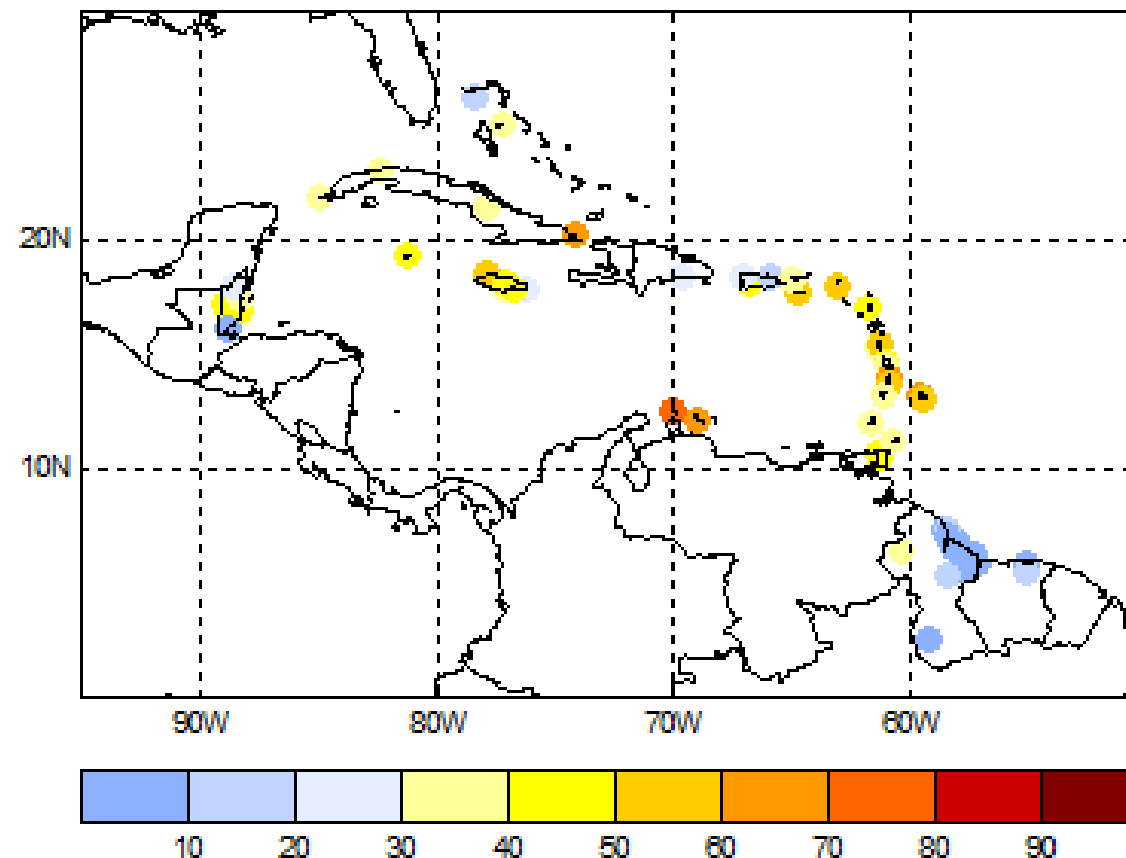


**FORECAST:** High to extremely high flash flood potential across the ABC Islands and the Lesser Antilles; high potential in Grand Cayman, Cuba and Jamaica; moderate to high potential in The Bahamas, Belize, Dominican Republic, Guyana and Suriname.

**FORECAST:** High flash flood potential in the ABC Islands, Barbados, far eastern Cuba and Dominica; moderate to high potential across the Antilles; moderate potential in The Bahamas, Belize, westernmost Guyana; marginal to slight potential elsewhere in Guyana and in Suriname.



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
