<b>Description:</b>	Partly cloudy to cloudy conditions and rainfall events have led to lower maximum temperatures and these conditions are forecast for at least the next three days. As a result, the hot spell warning is discontinued. The TTMS advises however, that Trinidad and Tobago is still in its heat season and warm to hot temperatures are still expected.		
<b>Instructions:</b>	The hottest time of the day is generally between 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. It is important to wear appropriate clothing, stay hydrated at all times, and keep out of direct sunlight to avoid sunburn. Open appropriate windows, vents and doors in your homes to ventilate at times. Prolonged exposure to hot conditions (high feel-like temperatures) can be hazardous to health, especially to the elderly, sick adults, and young children. Therefore, a proactive approach to lessen the effects of hot conditions should be adopted.
